# Important Member Information Historic & Conditional Registration

The MUVCCC is part of the Historic & Classic Club Plates Registration Scheme. Registration of such vehicles is available to Club Members with vehicles which qualify for the scheme. Club Members with such vehicles must carry the "Club Event Program" while participating in club events. (Note: You can also download this to your mobile phone or access to the Club website event page.)

#### **Key Points:**

- 1. You must be a financial member of an approved Car Club
- 2. You must also carry the Certificate of Approved Operation whilst using the vehicle.
- 3. If you drive a modified vehicle, it is highly recommended you carry the appropriate Engineering Certificate.
- 4. If you are using your vehicle for any other purpose, you must fill in your log book. This must be completed before leaving your residence and vehicle use under the logging date is valid for that nominated date only.

<u>Please note:</u> It is your responsibility as Member to ensure that you are a Current Financial Club Member, otherwise you are deemed to be driving an *unregistered vehicle*.

All memberships fall due on 30<sup>th</sup> June each year.





# New Members Fay & Steve Mitchell share their story of their "IMPERFECT PREFECT"!!

Back in 1963 Steve was not old enough to drive and he had no mechanical experience. However he had saved £45 and became the proud owner of a 1951 Ford Prefect in dubious condition. Under his uncle's guidance Steve spent most of his spare time learning about cars and how to keep them in working order. After two years the Prefect was sold.

Over the years we owned many second-hand cars of various makes and models, usually needing a lot of TLC to keep them



going.
However
Prefects still
held a special
place in
Steve's heart
and he had
dreams of
restoring
one.

He came home one day in 1986 and proudly showed me his "great find" ...a 1949 Ford Prefect which had been completely stripped down by someone planning to rebuild it.

Small parts like nuts, bolts and bearings had been stored in lots of jam jars, carefully labelled, but over time these had faded and were now illegible. There was a tangle of electrical wiring, wheels, mudguards, axles, seats, bumper bars all in a heap



looking nothing like a car!

Over the next 6 months
Steve worked tirelessly, sometimes

using unconventional methods to rebuild the car. New interior lining was made from felt I sewed on my sewing machine! Spray painting was done in our backyard. With Steve's hard work and ingenuity the pile of miscellaneous bits and pieces had been transformed into an attractive little car which even earned full rego! It now proudly displayed its new numberplate...FP 1949.

We were living near Wollongong at the time and Steve often drove the Prefect to work and occasionally on family outings. Our most memorable trip was on a rainy day trying to drive to the top of Mt. Keira for our first car club outing. With our two teenage girls in the back, our little Prefect was struggling in first

return down the slippery road with the whole family in the car was a risk not worth taking. We managed to turn around and head for home! After a while the novelty of driving a 38-year-old car wore thin and it was sold, making way for something more comfortable and reliable.

Decades later, Steve's mind again turned to the possibility of restoring an old Prefect. In December 2023 on our way home with our latest purchase, the wreck of a 49 model, we looked at another one advertised with lots of spares. Seeing the body was in excellent condition and the asking price was attractive we bought it without looking closely. After getting it home we found lots of paperwork in the glove box and we made a startling discovery. We found an invoice for work done in 1988 with the details showing it had the rego FP 1949! Amazingly we had bought the same car twice...the first time when it was all in pieces and again 37 years later! During the past few months Steve has been tinkering in our backyard swapping bits from one car to the other, installing some new parts, and I even made repairs to the felt lining on my sewing machine! Again Steve's hard work and persistence has made the same little imperfect Prefect roadworthy.





On Sunday morning, club members were greeted with a perfect day to enjoy a delightful brunch comprising of bacon, eggs in bread rolls with an assortment of sauces!! All attendees enjoyed a relaxing morning & great conversation. It was great to see many new club members in attendance (52!!) and see our cars looking resplendent in the morning sun. We are fortunate to be looked after so well with special thanks to Bev & Geoff Phillips for preparing the food, together with our BBQ team — with Roger as "Master of the BBQ" with assistance from Colin & Geoff.

We had a wonderful time, and encourage other members to take the opportunity to travel to regional locations. Car Clubs are really made to feel welcome!








# <u>Member Story:</u> <u>The McLennan's see "History</u> on Parade" in the UK


Many locals sit on the roadsides to view the rally & the nearby pubs have many onlookers with beer in hand, which seems like the ideal way to enjoy the day.

Upon arrival at the Felixstowe Pier, hundreds of people attend to get a chance to view the vehicles on display which remain there until 5 pm.


Now back in Australia, Jane & Alan have some wonderful memories!

We had planned for May's edition of Wheel Nuts to include a BBQ to celebrate Mother's Day! However, based




on weather forecasts, the wise decision was made to cancel the BBQ. On Sunday, 7 brave (??) souls attended – including our newest member, Mervyn
