Important Member Information Historic & Conditional Registration

The MUVCCC is part of the Historic & Classic Club Plates Registration Scheme. Registration of such vehicles is available to Club Members with vehicles which qualify for the scheme. Club Members with such vehicles must carry the "Club Event Program" while participating in club events. (Note: You can also download this to your mobile phone or access to the Club website event page.)

Key Points:

- 1. You must be a financial member of an approved Car Club
- 2. You must also carry the Certificate of Approved Operation whilst using the vehicle.
- 3. If you drive a modified vehicle, it is highly recommended you carry the appropriate Engineering Certificate.
- 4. If you are using your vehicle for any other purpose, you must fill in your log book. This must be completed before leaving your residence and vehicle use under the logging date is valid for that nominated date only.

<u>Please note:</u> It is your responsibility as Member to ensure that you are a Current Financial Club Member, otherwise you are deemed to be driving an *unregistered vehicle*.

All memberships fall due on 30th June each year.

Member Story: The Life & Times...& many Cars of Geoff Phillips




Geoff Phillips & his wife Bev are well known in the Club. Their "Life's journey" has had its ups & downs, but Geoff's love of cars remains. During his life, Geoff has owned over 14 cars ranging from a 1934 Plymouth to a 2014 VW Tiguan together with a list of company cars & trucks too numerous to count!

Growing up in the western suburbs of Sydney during the 50's & 60s gave Geoff plenty of opportunity to develop his driving skills. A Morris Oxford became the "Paddock Basher" of choice and provided some very entertaining moments!!



Fulfilling the fashion of the 60/70's, Geoff sported long hair & a beard - but he polished up well when he & Bev got married in 1972 – some 52 years ago! (People got married much younger then!!) Naturally, their wedding car was a very collectible vintage car (a bit of an improvement on the push bike Geoff used when courting Bev), however, the vehicle could only be driven during the day as it only had kerosene headlamps!!



Geoff's first car was a Hillman Hunter that, in Geoff's words "Used to Fly" (The Hillman Hunter GT won the first London to Sydney Marathon!!) He & a mate were travelling on the Hume in the late 1970s. Whilst giving the speedo "a good nudge" (3 figures in the old language), they spotted a red dot

in the rear vision mirror...closing fast! They were soon overtaken by the "then new" Mazda RX7 Rotary leaving them well behind!! After The Hillman, Geoff acquired a VC Valiant and then a 1969 VW Beetle – with "big wheels & extractors." It made quite a statement!

The couple started a family in the 1970s and being the sensible family man, he purchased a 2nd hand Toyota Corona Wagon. After he sold it, he later saw it on the road around Wentworthville in Sydney. After catching up with the current owner, the chap called out in a heavy Italian accent "Best-a-Bloody car I ever had!"

Geoff also took on a project to restore a Plymouth. Work progressed to the point of "strip-down", but as more children arrived, the unfinished project was deprioritised & then sold.






Geoff was unfortunate enough to be in a couple of accident, being rear ended twice by trucks!! His poor Sigma resembled an "inverted V" after the impact. For quite some time, Geoff developed a bit of a phobia when trucks were behind him. Quite understandable!

As time progressed and the kids left home, Geoff was able to once again indulge his interest in collectible vehicles. He found a vehicle in Sydney that was built in NZ. It was a replica of a 1954 MG TF with a 1300 motor costing only \$13,000 and is a "one-off." The vehicle was built on a Triumph Herald chassis using a fibreglass body, but it is a little shorter than the genuine article.

Geoff was very fond of this vehicle, although the footwell was rather tight. The vehicle was a real "head-turner" and was in great condition. Even better, he did not need to spend much on little MG - only about \$300 to renew the plastic side windows. It ran beautifully and Geoff & Bev enjoyed going out in the little MG, although it did leak a bit of oil, typical of such vehicles!!



Sadly, the MG TF was sadly lost in the fire at Milton Tyre Service in 2015. Geoff attended in his capacity as a RFS Captain of brigade. On attending the site, the building was totally engulfed. Geoff (jokingly) pulled rank and said "My car's in there – can someone go & get it?" Regrettably, 4

classic cars were lost in the fire and the MG TF was just charred remains.



Geoff was pleased with his insurers, who promptly paid his



claim, whilst the insurer of Milton Tyres paid his Insurance Excess. Later on, he received additional payment from his insurer on the basis of the MG TF being

underinsured!! Geoff still uses Milton Tyre Service, but won't leave cars overnight as part of his "risk management!!"

After the loss of the MG TF in 2015, Geoff replaced it with a 1969 MGB. It was a great little car but the time was right to purchase something with the benefits of modern safety equipment (at Bev's suggestion). Upon putting the vehicle up on Car Sales, Geoff soon had a hopeful buyer. The buyer arrived with some mates and paid Geoff the asking price — no haggling & more than Geoff hoped. The buyer wasn't even going to test drive the vehicle, but did so after some encouragement from Geoff. Geoff discovered he was a terrible driver who had difficulty with manuals!! After 3 years ownership, he had no regrets in selling it as he got a good price and it was time for a change.



Geoff now had some money to spend. A couple of years ago, he found a beautiful 2007 Mazda MX-5 with only 118,000km on the clock. When he and Bev went to inspect the car, Bev exclaimed "What a cute little car!!"



Bev generally doesn't say much about cars, so Geoff knew he was on a winner. Even better, it had modern safety features and the roof was easy to raise to stop Bev getting sunburnt. So today, Geoff has a "Modern Classic" that turns heads and more importantly, a car that Bev also enjoys!

In addition to the little Mazda, Geoff currently owns a VW Tiguan. He also admitted to your scribe that he once owned a Subaru Impreza – which in his *whispered words* "was a great little car!!", so your editor felt obliged to share this piece of information.

As a Captain in the Rural Fire Service, Geoff has seen his fair share of trauma. The 2019 fires were particularly challenging. His own suburb of Lake Conjola was directly affected. Whilst Geoff's home was safe, many people were not so fortunate. In addition, Geoff shared information about the challenges of "Electric Car Fires". These can be particularly dangerous as the vehicles use Direct Current (DC) and may make the car "live". So safety procedures are vital when attending such fires.

Throughout their lives, Geoff & Bev have had a variety of cars, with some more memorable than others. But, most memorable & most important is family.















<u>Coffee Run – Luci's Café Bawley Point</u>

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Club Member Feature: Geoff Johns hits the beach resurrecting the Meyers Manx!!

Most buggies of the sixties used to scream around the sand dunes with old flathead V8's and aircraft tyres until one day a small fibreglass buggy appeared on the scene, it changed everything in the buggy world. The owner of that buggy was Bruce Meyers from California and his creation would go on to win the Baja 1000 and create a cult following throughout the world.



The Meyers Manx Beach Buggy was listed as one of the ten most influential vehicles of the twentieth century. Everyone could now go out and find an old VW Beetle and build one for themselves.



I wanted one from the age of ten but it took me twentynine years to finally track one down and purchase it. It was a friend of mine who bought it in Sydney in 1996



when the Meyers Manx company first came to Australia. It was in the original lineup for the opening photographs and had been used in the ABC Sunday morning program called "Recovery".

My friend used and abused it on Stockton Beach for two years until he finally made one too many heavy landings of the sand dunes and broke the spine of the buggy so it was parked and put up for sale and I eventually had it in my possession in 1999.



It was still registered so I fixed it up so it would at least pass a pink slip but did nothing with it until 2016 when I undertook a complete nut and bolt restoration of everything.



It is a 1967 fibreglass body built in Surfers Paradise on a shortened by 14.25" 1962 VW pan.

The body was sent off to a fibreglass repairer in Warners Bay, a suburb of Newcastle who did a phenomenal job fixing the fibreglass rot, filling unwanted holes, fixing dodgy work from years ago and fixing the damage, body lines, gaps and coating the entire body with a two-pack high fill primer so that when it came time to paint, there would be one surface to adhere to not multiple ones.



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The paint colour is Mazda, "Soul Red Crystal" and was applied buy a well know painter in Charlestown, another Newcastle suburb. While all this was happening, I was cutting out all the rusted areas of the VW pan and I can tell you that there was not a lot of original metal left to work with. New floor pans, modified to fit the short wheel base, taking the twist out of the spline after all the abuse it took, rebuilding the frame head with new section bought from the USA and rebuilding or remanufacturing all the brackets, tubes and cables.



I installed a new wiring harness in the buggy, fitted H4 headlights, Honda Civic side markers for front blinkers and changed the original dash layout from single gauge

beetle to type 3 triple gauges from VW station wagon. I added, for my own peace of mind, a head temp, oil temp and oil pressure gauge. It runs a standard but fully rebuilt 1968 Swing Axle four speed gearbox and a 1641cc VW engine with a little work from Formula Vee race car heads and a stainless exhaust system from a VW based trike. It has a deep sump for cooling and a remote oil cooler with a thermostat fan. Seats are from a Mazda MX5 but I have tried to keep the look and feel as much in the '60/70's era as I can. I did stray from that with a front disc brake conversion with 2.5" drop spindles and still runs the original widened steel wheels from the sixties.

I am now working on finishing the hard top and soft top but my efforts were noticed as I picked up "Best Buggy" at the recent VW Nationals. Apart from the fibreglass and paint, I have pretty much done it all myself with a lot of help from my wife, Diane.

The buggy has been authenticated by Bruce and Winnie Myers as a genuine Meyers Manx.

This is just an overview of what has gone into this rebuild as all who have done this know. It took me six and a half years and I still have a few things I want to rectify and/or complete but I can now enjoy the summer days just as they were meant to be, more smiles per mile.
